For the past year, the LSU College of Music & Dramatic Arts has been undergoing a season of transformation and renewal as beloved, yet outdated facilities are brought up to modern standards, and outstanding programs are being recognized with names commensurate with their growth and rising stature. Each of these milestones tells the same story: the CMDA is stepping boldly into a new chapter, and the best is still to come.

School of Music Comes Home as Turner-Fischer Recital Hall Opens

As highlighted in the past two editions of Prologue, the School of Music Recital Hall has been undergoing a comprehensive renovation that will transform the beloved venue into a modern space, reimagined for the 21st century.

This transformation is emblematic of the CMDA's broader momentum: spaces that have long held the college's traditions are being renewed to match the scale, ambition, and growing prominence of the programs they support.

The CMDA is thrilled to announce that the John G. Turner & Hango G. Fischer Recital Hall will welcome back audiences this September with a special program designed to showcase everything the hall can now do—from its acoustic redesign and built-in speaker system to its new projectors, updated lighting, and state-of-the-art HVAC and humidity-control systems, among many other upgrades. It will be a first look at what this reimagined space can offer, and we can't wait to share it with you.

And the celebration won't stop there. Throughout the year, the CMDA will be welcoming back beloved LSU alumni and performers for special concerts in the hall. What a fitting way to honor the space's legacy while writing the first lines of its next chapter.

While the renovation over this past academic year allowed our ensembles and faculty to explore new spaces for performance and share their talents with the Baton Rouge community, students and

faculty alike are excited to have the CMDA's busiest performance space—which hosts close to 300 performances annually—back online. The Turner-Fischer Recital Hall returns not just restored, but transformed, and we invite the entire LSU and Baton Rouge community to experience it anew.

School of Theatre Renamed to School of Theatre & Film

The Recital Hall isn't the only place where a new chapter is being written. The Board of Regents recently approved the renaming of the School of Theatre to the LSU School of Theatre & Film, a milestone that reflects the school's evolving role within the university, the community, and Louisiana's booming film industry.

The film concentration has been part of the CMDA's story since 2012, when it was launched under the leadership of Kristin Sosnowsky. What began as a modest initiative has grown dramatically. Today, the Film BFA enrolls nearly 100 students, and admission has become increasingly competitive, with applications consistently outnumbering available spots. A key driver of that momentum was the program's shift from a BA to a BFA, which further cemented its identity as production-centric and career-focused. It also strengthened its role as a pipeline to careers across all areas of the cinematic arts.

Together, these developments underscore the school's growing prominence. The school is expanding its reach within Louisiana's film economy while deepening the collaborative environment that distinguishes theatre and film at LSU.

By officially including "Film" in its title, the school affirms its dual commitment to the stage and the screen. It also signals to prospective students, faculty, and industry partners that LSU is a premier destination for the next generation of storytellers. With roots stretching back to 1928, and a film program that has grown to nearly rival the size of the storied theatre program, the LSU School of Theatre & Film steps into this new chapter with a name that matches the full scope of its ambitions and the rigorous standards that have made the program increasingly selective.
